As we quickly approach the last week before the Christmas holidays, we hear in the news yet more guidance with changes to schools, this time a change in isolation rules (please see separate notice). You may have also heard reports about how the Schools Standards Minister has announced that schools Inset days can be used on Friday 18 December, even if not already scheduled. Our Inset days are already set and therefore would have to make up the hours in alternative ways. Furthermore, this short notice would leave many families, particularly working parents, without childcare arrangements. Therefore, I have decided that the last day of school will be 18th December as planned. After all, we have worked really hard, families and staff, to keep our school open and we would like to enjoy the last few days with the children.

Although we had some good news regarding the vaccine, we know schools will continue battling with the virus for a long time yet. Therefore, I am appealing to all parents, children and staff to remain alert and continue with all precautions to maintain the safety of our community. Please remember we are just coming out of a full lockdown and even so, the spread of the virus in the community remains high.

We must all observe the rules and guidance from the Government and this includes not mixing households. Please refrain from children's parties or sleepovers, giving people a lift or picking other people's children from school unnecessarily. You mustn't meet anyone socially indoors - at a private home or public setting - unless they're from your household or support bubble. Remember it is all our responsibility to look after each other. Let's look after each other even if that means 'keeping our distance'.

Breaking News – Shorter self-isolation period announced today

The government has announced that self-isolation for contacts of people with confirmed coronavirus will be shortened from 14 days to 10 days, across the UK from Monday 14th December. This means that all children are expected back in school on Monday 14th December, unless they are isolating because of a contact with a case of coronavirus from outside school. Children in Year 5, who were previously due to return on Thursday 17th December and children in Reception, who were previously due to return on Friday 18th, should now return on Monday 14th.

Remote Learning for children still isolating

Next week the teachers will be setting work in Google Classroom for the week. However, as it is the last week in the run up to Christmas, much of the learning will be based on practical activities. When you visit Google Classroom from Monday you will find a timetable and activities that can be completed independently at home.

Christmas Parties

Class Christmas parties will now take place next week. You will receive details from the class teachers.

Nativities

Year 1 Nativity took place yesterday, Thursday 10th December. Year 2 Nativity will take place on Thursday 17th December. Miss Smith will contact the Reception class with a date for the Reception Nativity.

Nasal Flu Vaccinations

The immunisation team will return to school on Tuesday 15th December to vaccinate those children whose parents have given permission, but were not in school last Monday.

Individual School Photographs

The school photographer will return to school on Tuesday 12th January to take photographs of those children who were not in school today.
