Gospel Reflection

Luke 18:1-8

Today we hear about a bad judge and a widow who would not give up. Jesus teaches us the importance of justice, of praying and of never giving up hope. Let us find out more.

Jesus tells us a story about a bad judge and a widow who wants justice – who wants what is right.

Judges are supposed to be fair and honest, but this is not always the case. The prophets in the Bible were always getting angry with bad judges who thought more about themselves than about the people who needed their help. If the judges did not sort out the problems fairly then people would suffer again and again.

The widow was ignored by the law, but she didn't give up. She just kept asking the judge to make things right.

Eventually, just to get rid of her, he gave her what she wanted, justice. Her prayers were finally answered.

The widow is like us - we call to God in our prayers to give us what we need and want.

Jesus says that God hears the cries of all who call out to him day and night. God will certainly answer our prayers, even if it's not in the way that we expect.

Prayer:

God, who always hears us, help us to make a change when we see something that is not right in our world.

May we find strength to keep going, even if at first we are not heard.
