Recently I wrote to you letting you know about some of the meetings I had with our School Council. One of the areas they felt very strongly about, if you remember, was our uniform. Our children are very proud of our school. They love attending St Vincent's and they want to show this with pride when they are out in the community. They asked me if they could have the school logo on their jumper to say confidently, "I am part of the St Vincent's team". They have explained to me how important that sense of belonging is to them, the knowing that they are in it together. That pride is reciprocated by the school and so we want to let everyone know that we are proud of our children, each and every one of them.

I announced to the School Council representatives yesterday, that I have decided to make that first change in our uniform and I will concede their wishes. Therefore, from September, parents will be able to purchase from school, a navy sweatshirt with our school logo. I understand this is a change and many children may have their uniform already. Please be assured this is in addition to the choices you already have and it is not compulsory. I have included a sample image of the new sweatshirt below. Sizes will range from 22''-34'' and XS - L. Prices will be confirmed before the end of the term and I think you will agree, when I say, what an achievement the School Council has made.

One more request that the children made is regarding changes in the systems we have during playtime and lunchtime. They had great organisational ideas and suggestions about new games to play during breaks. The school will be able to purchase new playtime equipment to supplement the changes.

The School Council has taken their responsibility very seriously and are a great help, particularly when I would like to see the school's needs "through the eyes of a child".

John 3:14-21

Jesus was back in his home town and teaching in the synagogue. The people who knew him were very surprised. They thought that they knew who Jesus was – the son of Mary and of Joseph the carpenter. They thought Jesus was just an ordinary man, but he wasn't. Jesus is the Son of God. But the people he had grown up with could not accept that Jesus was special. They did not believe in him. Sometimes when we know someone very well we can forget how special they are. It can be hard to see past all the things we know about them, to what they are really like. The people listening to Jesus in today's reading, judge him because of who he is and where he comes from. They are not willing to listen to him or to change their minds, even though he shows wisdom in his teaching. Do you think this is right? Why not? Let's try not to judge anyone for where they come from or who their family is, but instead listen to them, look out for the special things that they do, and see
