Dear Parents and Carers.

October is traditionally the month of the Holy Rosary. As a Catholic school, we take this time to pause, pray and remember that Mary leads us closer to Jesus. Each Tuesday at 8:45am in the hall, we pray the Rosary in school and we warmly invite parents to join us if they wish. These prayer times are led by our Year 6 Spiritual Leaders, who guide a decade with reverence and confidence. Families might like to pray a decade at home too; a small, simple practice that helps us to make space for God in busy days.

Throughout October we will keep returning to the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries as part of our worship and RE learning.

October is also Black History Month in the UK. In school we are celebrating the achievements and contributions of Black Britons and communities around the world. We feel it is important for children to celebrate and keep the message alive, and we aim to embed Black history into our curriculum as a natural thread—from literature and music to science, art and local history—so that all children see themselves reflected and respected.

Across the school, children are exploring inspiring stories, discussing role models, and reflecting on how we can be upstanders who challenge injustice with courage and kindness. As ever, our approach links learning with our Gospel values and the common good.

- Join us for Rosary on Tuesdays at 8:45am in the hall
- Pray a decade of the Rosary together one evening this week.
- Talk about Black History Month at home: Who inspires you? How can we keep the message alive all year round?
- Visit your local library or museum to find books and displays that celebrate Black history and culture.
- Ask your child which Mystery of the Rosary they prayed this week and what it helped them to think about.

Thank you for supporting prayer and learning at home. Together, we help our children to grow in wisdom, dignity and joy.
