Dear parents and families,

As part of our journey through Lent to Holy Week, Sister Josephine has been speaking to our children about the Stations of the Cross. Children had the opportunity to learn about Christ's journey, by looking at the 14 key moments in the trial, crucifixion and burial of Jesus. Children also learnt about the 15th station, the Resurrection of Christ.

We also had a visit from Father Mario, who came to talk to children about the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Children understood the importance of healing and cleansing their soul by reconciling with God. Father Mario talked about the importance of the three actions for Lent: Alms giving, Fasting and Prayer. In school, we talk to our children about: Give, Act and Pray, three words that simplify the difficult and abstract concepts behind Lent. Father Mario also talked to us about the need to go to confession at least every season, to ensure we seek forgiveness and we repair our relationship with our Lord.

Reconciliation (officially called the Sacrament of Penance and also known as Confession) is a Sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in his love and mercy to offer us forgiveness.

This sacrament allows Jesus to absolve our sins and helps us lead a life following the guidance and glory of Christ.

The forgiveness of sins involves four parts:

- Contrition: A sincere sorrow for having offended God, and a firm resolve not to repeat our sin.
- Confession: Confronting our sins in a profound way to God, by speaking them aloud to the priest.
- **Penance:** An important part of our healing is the penance the priest gives us in reparation for our sins.
- Absolution: The priest speaks the words by which we are reconciled to God and we are absolved from our sins.

Children in Years 4, 5 and 6 who have received the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) will be invited to attend confession next week.

Gospel Reflection

John 4:5-42

Jesus is thirsty and so he asks a Samaritan woman for a drink from the well.

The woman is surprised because normally Jews and Samaritans did not get along. It was also unusual at the time for a man to talk to a woman he did not know.

However, even though it is unusual, Jesus talks to the woman anyway.

Jesus is showing us that God loves everyone, no matter who they are, where they come from or the colour of their skin – man or woman, boy or girl, rich or poor.

Even though we are all different, we still need the same things to live.

Just like Jesus in this story, we all need water to drink. We need food to eat. A safe place to live, somewhere to learn and someone to look after us when we are sick.

Jesus shows the woman that he is Christ, the Son of God, by knowing all about her life even though he has never met her before.

God also knows everything there is to know about us. And God loves us.

Sometimes people forget that God loves us all and that we are part of one global family. They only see the differences between themselves and another group of people. This can lead to many problems.

It can lead to people not being very nice to each other. Which can also mean that there are arguments and fighting.

God asks us to love and care for all people no matter who they are because we are all part of one global family. To help each other when things are difficult and to work together to make the world a better place for everyone to live in.

So this week let us do what we can to help other people. Let us treat those who are different to us with kindness and respect. Let us share with others and try to live in peace.

Jesus shows us that we should treat all people kindly, even if they are different to us. Therefore, we ask for God's help as we pray:

Caring God, fill our hearts with love for all your people. Move us to treat all people with kindness and respect and to work to make the world a better place for everyone to live in.
