
## **Ukraine Appeal**

### Luke 9:28-36

In today's gospel we hear about an amazing thing that happened to Jesus, which showed the disciples just how important he was. A great change came over him. Let's think about the changes we can make during Lent.

Jesus goes up a hill with Peter, James and John to pray. While he is praying a great change comes over him. His face was changed and his clothes became sparkling white.

Then a voice came from the clouds saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen - listen to him."

Jesus is changed. And everything changes for the disciples too. After all, they know now that Jesus really is the Son of God.

Through our prayers this Lent we can hope for wonderful changes too We can ask God to help us to act differently, to make the world a fairer place, and to treat others as we would wish to be treated.
