Dear Parents and Carers,

At St Vincent's, we want every child to thrive — and one of the biggest factors in a child's progress, confidence, and long-term achievement is simple: being in school, every day, on time.

This half term, our whole-school attendance for Years 1–6 sits at 96.2%, which is above the national average.

That's something to feel proud of, and I want to thank the many families who make punctual, regular attendance part of their daily routine.

However, we do still have some children whose absence levels are creeping up. Our persistent absence figure is 9.7%, which, although lower than national, still means a number of pupils are missing significant learning time.

Research from the Department for Education makes it clear: children with the best attendance achieve the best outcomes. Even a few days missed each term add up quickly — gaps form, confidence dips and it becomes harder for children to keep pace.

Regular attendance is also a safeguarding matter. School is often the safest, most stable part of a child's day, and good attendance helps us spot early if a child needs support.

Parents have a legal duty to ensure children attend school regularly. We know family life gets busy — illnesses happen, unexpected challenges arise — and we're here to support wherever we can. If you're struggling with routines, anxieties, medical issues, or anything else affecting attendance, please talk to us early so we can help.

At the same time, the guidance from the London Borough of Bromley is very clear. Unauthorised absences, including holidays taken during term time, may lead to a Penalty Notice where thresholds are met. These are issued by the Local Authority under the national framework.

Just a reminder that term-time holidays cannot be authorised unless there are truly exceptional circumstances — and these are extremely rare. Unauthorised holiday absence of 10 sessions (5 school days) within a 10-week period usually triggers consideration for a penalty notice.

We want to keep building on the positive picture we already have. Here's how we can all play our part:

- Aim for 100% attendance wherever possible.
- **Avoid term-time holidays** they have a real impact.
- **Keep up good morning routines** so children arrive on time and ready.
- Talk to us early if something is making attendance difficult.
- Work with us on any support plans or next steps if your child is falling below expected levels.

Every day really does make a difference. When children attend consistently, they learn more, develop stronger friendships, and feel more secure.

Let's keep working together to make sure every child has the best possible chance to shine.
