Dear Parents and families,

Re: Hot weather

As you may be aware, we are expecting very high temperatures on Monday and Tuesday and we would like to ensure your child is well protected from the heat whilst at school. Schools follow the same rules as workplaces for staying open in the heat, meaning there is no limit at which children must legally be sent home.

You might hear on the news how some schools are choosing to relax their uniform rules, such as switching from trousers to shorts or removing ties and blazers.

Our Summer uniform is already adapted for hot weather. We encourage children to wear summer dresses, shorts instead of trousers and short sleeve shirts. As an exception to our rules, we will allow children to remove their ties and undo their top button if needed.

Other steps we are taking:

Before School:

- Parents are encouraged to ensure students apply sunscreen before they come to school, and to bring this with them in order to re-apply it when necessary.
- It is important that your child bring a bottle of water to school, which can be re-filled during the day as needed.
- Students should also bring a sun hat, which covers their head, neck and ears for their PE Lessons. Baseball hats are not appropriate because they do not shield the neck, ears or face.

During School:


- We will encourage the students to stay in the shade during playtime and lunch, and additional spaces will be made available inside the building.
- Pupils will be encouraged to have their water bottles in the classroom and to drink at regular intervals. There are a number of water fountains in school, where students can re-fill bottles at break, lunch or between lessons.
- As far as possible, PE classes will take place in shaded areas or inside spaces. Students will be reminded to wear their sun hats and have water bottles with them. If the heat is excessive, alternative activities will be arranged for your child in a classroom space.
- We will use alternative places, to teach some classes elsewhere if the temperature indoors is unacceptably hot.

I would also consider closing the school earlier, however, this will be a consideration only when we have exhausted all other strategies and the learning conditions remain unacceptable.

Gospel Reflection

Luke 10:38-42

Jesus is welcomed into the house of a woman called Martha. Martha has a sister called Mary who is pleased to see Jesus and immediately sits down to hear him speak. Martha is busy with tasks. Perhaps she is getting Jesus a drink, making him some food, making sure he has everything he needs.

Martha wants Mary to do some of these jobs too and she asks Jesus to tell Mary to help her. Jesus tells Martha that Mary is doing the right thing, by taking time to sit and listen to him.
