


## Newsletter 15<sup>th</sup> October 2021

Mark 10:35-45

Jesus said that the greatest disciple was not the one who went around showing off his power, or money, or things. But rather that the greatest disciple must be like a servant – humble and helping others in all that they do.

Jesus did not come as a King, but to serve all of mankind. He put our needs first, and died on the cross to save our sins.

Congratulations to Fadie (father of Siena in Reception class) for completing the 35th Edition of **Marathon Des Sables**, a 250km self-sufficient race across the Sahara Desert over 6 days. Fadie conquered temperatures of over 50 degrees, climbing mountain faces and sand dunes to finish in 19th place (top 3 British runner) out of the 672 people who started the race.

Fadie took on the challenge to raise money for the East Anglian Air Ambulance who were part of the team that saved his brother's life 6 years ago.
