Dear parents and families,

Such a group of volunteers is key to providing the school with additional money to pay for activities and resources which are not necessarily included in our Learning Curriculum.

I am sure that many parents who generously come and purchase their raffle tickets and cakes from our different events, often wonder where the money goes to.

The money raised by the PTA events, as well as all other fundraising events in school, e.g. non uniform days, go to pay for activities that otherwise we would not have in school. For example, we 'send some funding to Santa' in exchange for the Christmas presents the children receive. We regularly pay for playground equipment as it requires frequent replacement of toys and resources. We also cover some of the cost of the Year 6 residential. These are some of the regular occasions when the PTA helps the school on a yearly basis. However, the PTA usually has a greater target in mind. In the past they have purchased our Trim Trail, enjoyed by many children in our school through the years.

At the moment, our PTA is determined to fundraise money to provide the school with new laptops and computers, which is an ambitious target. We have an objective of £15,000. Luckily we had a hugely successful Christmas Fair and now the Easter Fair. This, combined with very generous donations from some families in our school, makes for a really good start. I predict that we are probably not too far from our goal!

The only part that was not too complimentary to our Easter Fair, was the weather. We had it all, sunshine, rain, sleet, fog, clouds, but above all, we had COLD!

Thank you very much to all parents who patiently stood in the playground whilst your children were taking part. I would also like to say thank you to all volunteers who stoically braved the weather to ensure everything ran smoothly, particularly for the Easter Egg Hunt during which the adults were in the playground for about two hours!

The children were very excited and loved every minute of it, and that is the important part, thank you all.

Gospel Reflection

John 8:1-11

When people have done something wrong to us we often feel angry and want them to be punished. But in today's gospel Jesus teaches us that this isn't always the right way.

The scribes and Pharisees bring a woman to Jesus who has done something wrong. The law says that she should be punished, but the Pharisees ask Jesus what he would do.

Jesus says that the person who has done nothing wrong themselves, should be the person who throws the first stone at the woman.

Slowly, all the scribes and Pharisees leave, until just the woman and Jesus are left.

Jesus says that he will not punish her either, but that she should go away and try to do the right thing from now on.

We have all done things wrong occasionally. Jesus knows that none of us is perfect. He forgives us for the things that we have done wrong and no matter what, he always loves us. But he also asks us to change, to try our hardest not to do the wrong thing again.

Jesus asks us not to judge people who have done something wrong, because we all do wrong things sometimes. Instead we should try to forgive them, as God forgives us. But we should also try to help them see that they need to change, so that they no longer do what is wrong.

We all have times when we are treated unfairly and it hurts. We also all have times when we are not quite as nice to others as we should be.

Let us try to forgive those who treat us unfairly and to follow Jesus' example of love for all people. But let's also try to make a change – to do what is right, and to help others to feel God's love in the way that we treat them.

Prayer

God of love, you forgive us when we go wrong, and encourage us to try again to be better. Guide us to do what is right and to make this world a fairer place for all who live in it. Amen.
