

Turn on the subtitles

It gives us a brilliantly simple idea—turning on the subtitles can double the chances of a child becoming good at reading.

Therefore, the next time your child is watching TV or the tablet, there could actually be an opportunity to improve their reading skills at the same time! In fact, research has shown that it can double the chance of your child leaving school as a proficient reader. You can turn them on for the whole family or most streaming services will now allow you to do it just for individual children, if you like.

Gospel Reflection

John 11:1-45

Today we hear about an amazing thing that Jesus does when his friend Lazarus becomes sick and dies. Let us think a bit more about this today.

Jesus hears that his friend Lazarus who lives in Bethany is sick. By the time Jesus gets there, Lazarus is dead and has been buried for four days.

Jesus goes to the tomb and asks them to roll away the stone, which was blocking the entrance. He tells Lazarus to come out of the tomb. Lazarus walks out, covered in the cloths that he was buried in.

Unfortunately, sometimes, just like Lazarus in today's gospel, people do get sick. When this happens, they go to the hospital where doctors and nurses work hard to care for them and try to make them better.

It can be very sad and worrying when someone we love is sick or dies. Jesus knows how we feel. He cried for his friend Lazarus, whom he loved.

Not everyone gets to see a doctor when they need to. It can be a long way to go to the nearest hospital or they might not be able to pay for their medicine.

Some people find it hard to stay healthy because they do not have enough food to eat or clean water to drink.

God gives life to us all. God created us and wants every single one of us to live a happy life, with all the things that we need to grow, and to be the best people we can be.

Jesus came to show us how to live, how to treat others. This Lent we can look at our own lives and think about the changes that we can make so that everyone can live their lives to the full.

God gives life to us all and so we pray together...
