Gospel Reflection

Luke 6:39-45

Jesus talks about how we have all done things that are wrong. Instead of picking on the tiny mistakes of others, we should change the things that are not so good about our own behaviour.

Jesus is talking to the disciples – he talks about seeing a tiny speck of dust in someone else's eye, but not seeing the great wooden log in our own. Jesus is saying it is much easier to notice the mistakes that others make, than it is to realise when we have made a mistake or done something wrong ourselves.

He says they must take the log out of their own eye before they can take the speck out of someone else's. He is saying we must change the way we act before we can expect anyone else to change. It's not always easy to change the way we act but perhaps we can all try this week. God can help us. If we let him, God will fill our hearts with goodness and love, hope, courage and generosity. Filled with these things, we will not be able to stop ourselves from wanting to share them with others.

Jesus says in this reading that good people have a store of goodness in their heart; that the words someone says come from what is in their heart. So if we let God fill our hearts with goodness and love, we will be able to speak words that share that goodness and love with others.

Prayer

Generous God, lead us to be the people you know we can be. Fill us with courage and goodness.

Help us to make a change so that the world may be a better place for all people.
