We come to the end of the first half of the summer term and to a very special week ahead of us. On the first weekend of June, her Majesty the Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee to mark the anniversary of her coronation.

Any Jubilee is an occasion to celebrate the life and reign of a monarch, and is a **significant** event, celebrated around the world. Through British history, there have been occasions to celebrate silver and gold jubilees and even a couple of diamond jubilees. However, the celebration of a platinum jubilee is a remarkable achievement after 70 years of service.

This event, a once in a lifetime, will be remembered by our children for years to come as an unprecedented milestone in history. Elizabeth II, now 96, remains a highly popular monarch, admired for her work ethic and undramatic moral fibre. Gospel Reflection

John 17:20-26

Today we hear how Jesus prayed to God for all those people, like us, who would come to believe in him. Let's listen and think more about this now...

Jesus is praying to God for his disciples, but not only for his friends who were with him during his life. Jesus also prays for all those people who will come to believe in him through the disciples, no matter when or where they will live.

This means Jesus was praying to God for us. Jesus asked that all his people could be as one. This means that they all stand united; they love one another, live peacefully and work together.

We are all different. We all have differences. These things make us special. They make me, me and you, you.

Even though we are different, we have lots of things in common with each other. There is one very special thing, which we all share. God loves us. We are all sisters and brothers, no matter who we are or where in the world we live. We are all part of one global family, loved by God.
