Dear parents and families

As May is traditionally a month dedicated to Mary, to help us mark this special Marian month, we will be praying the rosary in school.

When praying the rosary, we are invited to reflect on the joyful, sorrowful, glorious and luminous mysteries revealed in the Gospels. By reflecting on these stories we grow closer to God and we increase our understanding of the life of Jesus. We can also reflect on how God is calling us to live our own lives.

I would like to invite all parents and children to pray the Rosary with us. We will have a prayer and reflection session on Tuesdays in our school hall from 8:45 to about 9:00. This is a voluntary session and children can choose to come and pray with me or to go directly to class as they would normally do.

I am aware of the limitation on time that we have available and so, we will pray one decade every Tuesday. We want to mark the intention for our prayers for peace in our world.

When Our Lady of Fatima appeared to the three shepherd children on May 13, 1917, her message was clear, "Pray the Rosary every day in order to obtain peace for the world." Her message reaches into our times as well, and serves as a valuable reminder.

There are four mysteries in the Rosary: the Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminous, and Glorious Mysteries.

**The Sorrowful Mysteries** are usually prayed on Tuesdays: The Agony of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, The Scourging of Jesus at the Pillar, The Crowning of Jesus with Thorns, The Carrying of the Cross, The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus.

We will begin on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup>, you are all welcome to attend. Please bring your own rosary, if you wish.

#### John 21:1-19
