Dear parents and families,

We are pleased to inform you that our Christmas Fair will be starting at 2pm on Wednesday 14th December and will run until 4pm, with our grotto open until 4.30pm.

We are offering families the opportunity to collect children early on that day, so that they can attend the Christmas Fair during the afternoon. We have organised a staggered collection time for the day. Please note that siblings may be collected at the same time. Please note the early collection is not compulsory; children will remain in school until the usual time unless you decide to collect early.

Please see below for the optional early collection times for each class.

Reception Class children may be collected from 1.50pm from their usual end of day collection point.

Year 1 and 2 children may be collected from 2pm. Year 1 may be collected from their usual end of day collection point. Year 2 may be collected from this same point – the exit with the ramp, rather than the usual end of day collection point.

Year 3 and 4 children may be collected from 2.15pm. Children in both classes may be collected from the middle doors.

Year 5 and 6 children may be collected from 2.30pm. Children in both classes may be collected from the middle doors.

We will be running many exciting stalls at the Christmas Fair. It will be cash only on the day, so please start saving your coins!

We have a fabulous raffle with prizes being added all of the time (please see additional flyer) and tickets will be on sale before/after school from under the canopy area on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Father Christmas Visit

We are also excited to announce that we will have some visits from Father Christmas!

To avoid disappointment, we will be ticketing this event. Families can buy tickets in advance, which we recommend to secure a place. Advance tickets will be available to collect and buy from under the canopy in the morning or after school on Monday 5th December, Tuesday 6th December and Thursday 8th December.

If you are unable to purchase a ticket in person, please email the school office by Thursday 8th December. Payment must be sent in by this date, to receive your ticket on Friday 9th December.

The Grotto will be open on Wednesday from 2pm to 4.30pm, and on Thursday 15 from 3.15pm to 4pm. Upon purchase of a ticket, you will be able to choose a day for your visit.

Cost of tickets (this is only for visits to Father Christmas): £3.50 per child, £6 for two siblings, £8 for three or more siblings.
