Harvest Food Bank Collection

In the spirit of St Vincent de Paul and our Catholic social teaching—particularly the *preferential* option for the poor—we are launching a collection for our local food bank. Many families in our wider community are feeling the pinch, and practical help like tins, long-life food and toiletries makes a real difference.

Please bring donations to school from **Monday 6th October to Thursday 16th October**. Children can hand items to their class teacher each morning, or families may use the drop-off point at the school foyer.

Most-needed items (no fresh or chilled, please)

- Tinned soup, beans, tomatoes, vegetables, meat or fish
- Pasta, rice, noodles, cereal, oats
- Long-life milk, UHT juice, squash
- Tea, coffee, hot chocolate, sugar
- Toiletries (toothpaste, soap, shampoo), deodorant, sanitary products
- Baby items (nappies, wipes, formula)
- Treats that lift spirits (biscuits, cereal bars, chocolate)

Please ensure items are unopened, in date, and ideally in smaller/family-size packs. Avoid glass where possible.

Our Mini Vinnies will help to sort and count donations and prepare them for delivery to the food bank on **Friday 17th October**. We'll share an update with the final totals so children can see the impact of their generosity.

If you are finding things difficult at the moment, please speak to me in confidence or contact the school office. We can help with referrals or signpost to local support services.

Thank you for anything you can give—every item helps. Together, as a school family, we can offer practical kindness to our neighbours.
