Vaccinations

We have been asked to pass on this message to parents.

"The best way to keep your child safe and protect them from severe illness from polio, measles, mumps, rubella and other childhood diseases is to keep them up to date with their routine vaccinations.

In London vaccination rates have been falling, with one in four London children now behind on their routine vaccinations. There has also been a concerning <u>rise in measles cases in London</u> this year. This means children are at risk of becoming seriously unwell and why it is important to ensure their children are up to date with their childhood vaccinations.

The current campaign is focusing on under-vaccinated children aged 1 to 11 years who are least protected and at the highest risk of becoming seriously unwell with preventable disease such as polio and measles. Some schools have been contacted by the School Age Immunisation Service to run clinics after school, and there will also be additional community-based clinics during the school holidays.

Parents whose children are not up to date with their routine immunisations, are advised to call their GP to make an appointment or arrange an appointment at a community clinic by calling 020 8487 1730 (08.30-4.30 Monday to Friday) or email <u>hrch.immunisationcallcentre@nhs.net</u>
