Research shows that reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income.

The **evidence base** shows there are six building elements that support a child to read for pleasure

- Being read to regularly
- Having books at home and at school
- Having a choice in what to read
- Finding time to read
- Having trusted help to find a book
- Making reading FUN!



Your child has received a book token, worth  $\pounds 1$ , which they can redeem in a range of shops for specific World Book Day books- or use to receive  $\pounds 1$  off other books. You might want to save your token and use it in our Book Fair, which is coming up later on this month.

Reading for pleasure does not make children better at reading; it makes them better at learning.

#### **Gospel Reflection**

#### Matthew 17:1-9

Today we hear about something very special that happened to Jesus while he was on a mountain with three of his friends. His appearance changed as his face and clothes shone like the sun. This also changed the lives of his friends, as they realised that Jesus was the Son of God. We can change people's lives through our actions, let us think about how, today.

Jesus goes to the top of a mountain with Peter, James and John. When he gets there his appearance changes – his face and clothes shine with light.

A voice comes from a cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' The disciples are very afraid, but Jesus tells them not to be and everything looks normal again.

We can hear God's voice when we stop and pray, when we make time for God in our lives and when we make the right choices in how we treat others.

The disciples' lives are changed by what happened on the mountain. They now know just how special Jesus really is – that he is God's Son. They have seen his face shine like the sun and they have heard God speak to them.

Our lives are changed by Jesus too. Jesus lives in all of us. He asks us to always try to do what is right, to stand up for what we believe in and to help other people. Jesus calls us to show God's love to others.

Our love for one another can also shine out like the sun, as we treat all people as we would like to be treated by others.

People all around the world are different but they were all made by God. Every person is unique and special.

Jesus' appearance was changed on the mountain. As we try to change our lives and the lives of others, we pray together...
