
I look forward to seeing you all after the half term break.

Stars of the Week




- Year 1 Olumide for working hard in class and for being polite and helpful.

Luke 5:1-11

Jesus borrows Simon's boat so that he can teach the crowds that are around him on the shore. When he has finished speaking he tells Simon Peter to put out his fishing nets into deep water. Simon does not think they will catch anything. They haven't caught anything all night.

Peter did as Jesus said and sailed out to the deeper water where he cast out his nets. Although he felt unsure, Peter already trusted Jesus and was ready to do what he asked.

When Simon Peter and his friends put out the nets, they catch so many fish, and they are so heavy, the boat nearly sinks!
