

Gospel Reflection

Mark 10:17-30

The rich man asks Jesus what he must do to have eternal life. What does Jesus say?

Jesus reminds the man of the Ten Commandments, that he should not kill, should not steal or tell lies, and that he must respect his parents.

The man says that he has kept all of the commandments since he was young. And so Jesus gives him an extra challenge. What was it that Jesus asked the man to do?

Jesus asked the man to sell his nice things and to give all his money to people who are poor. Once he had done this, Jesus said that the man could follow him.

How would you feel if someone came along and said that you had to sell all your favourite toys, or that you had to give them away to someone who didn't have any?

But this is exactly what Jesus does ask of us. That if we have more than enough, we share what we have with others. That way all people in the world would be able to have the things that they need.

It is important to share things so that everyone has enough and so that the world is a fairer place for everyone to live.

Closing prayer: Generous God, we thank you for all the gifts that you have given us. Teach us to share these gifts with others, so all people may have enough. Amen.
