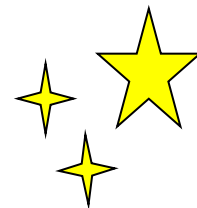

## Applications for Reception Class September 2026

The application process for Reception places in September 2026 opened on 1 September 2025, for children whose date of birth falls between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022.

The national **closing date for applications is 15 January 2026.**

The national offer date for on-time Reception applications is 16 April 2026.

If you are a Bromley resident, you should make your application through London Borough of Bromley. You can name schools outside of Bromley on your application, if you wish.

If you live outside of Bromley, you need to apply through the local authority where you live and can name Bromley schools on that application, if you wish.

In addition to the official council application, please complete a Supplementary Information Form, which can be picked up from the school office or downloaded from the school website.
